R258-16 Resolution Authorizing and Ratifying Sanitary Sewer Emergency Services on Route 3

**RESOLUTION AUTHORIZING AND RATIFYING SANITARY SEWER
EMERGENCY SERVICES ON ROUTE 3**

WHEREAS, a report, dated April 27, 2016 was submitted to the City Manager by City Engineer Michael J. Lardner, which indicated the need for emergency work to the sanitary sewer on Route 3; and

WHEREAS, the report notes that the sewer crew called out on the emergency situation was unable to restore the broken sanitary sewer pipe that was discharging directly into the storm sewer on Route 3 and needed to be excavated and repaired; and

WHEREAS, because of the emergent nature of the broken pipe discharging to open waters, which would have impacted the health, safety and welfare of the public, it was necessary to engage the services of Montana Construction, Inc. of Lodi, New Jersey to cope with the emergency conditions, all without the necessity of formal bidding for services; and

WHEREAS, the emergency was abated by the replacement of a section of sanitary sewer pipe and restoration of the roadway; and

WHEREAS, The City Engineer recommends an expenditure to cover the cost of the work at this location, and this Governing Body wishes to approve and ratify the emergency services and the expenditure of funds:

NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED, by the Mayor and Municipal Council of the City of Clifton that the emergency sanitary sewer work performed on Route 3 by Montana Construction, Inc. is hereby approved and ratified, and an amount not to exceed \$16,909.66 is authorized to be allocated to this project.
