CITY MANAGER PRIVILEGE

FLOOR TO MEMBERS OF THE PUBLIC

Robin Gibson, 12 Dwight Terrace, announced a candlelight vigil for the victims and families of the Las Vegas shooting to be held on City Hall Grounds, October 9, 2017 at 7pm.

Andrew White, 37 Hudson St, announced he will be running as a candidate in the next Board of Education Election.

April Grinkin, 15 Prospect St. and Natalie Forde, 31 Prospect St., spoke about wild animals, garbage, speeding and the lack of street lights on Prospect Street.

Ellen DeLosh, 547 Clifton Ave., read a letter from Christian Reviving Americas Values

Raymond Robertello, 64 Woodlawn Ave., congratulated the girls' softball team on their recent State Championship. He thanked the City Manager and Council for a fine job regarding all the recent road and drainage work completed the Woodlawn Avenue area.

Mayor Anzaldi asked City Manager, Dominick Villano, to investigate the animal, speeding, lighting and garbage issues on Prospect Street. Councilman Eagler suggested that the Health Department distribute flyers in the area to guide neighbors on what they can do to help the situation.

COUNCIL PRIVILEGE

Councilman Eagler

Councilman Eagler thanked the Police and Fire Departments for their participation in the Pulaski Day Parade. He expressed his condolences to the victims and families of the recent Las Vegas shooting. Councilman Eagler asked if a date was set for the Ballot Box. Mayor Anzaldi said a date will be finalized and that the last day for voter registration is October 17th. Councilman Eagler stated that Halloween is approaching and urged all residents to be safe when installing decorations. He also mentioned that it is getting dark earlier and that all residents should be cautious when traveling.

Councilman Gibson

Councilman Gibson addressed the residents of Prospect Street and said that the City will be moving forward regarding the issues they brought to the Council's attention tonight. He thanked Mr. Robertello for his kind words regarding the work done on Woodlawn Avenue. Councilman Gibson wished Mr. White the best on his candidacy for the Board of Education. He made the following announcements: Clifton Downtown Street Fair and the Passaic-Clifton Lions Club Tricky Tray. Councilman Gibson congratulated the girls' softball team on their recent State Championship. He also congratulated Carlos Polanco for being elected National Youth of the Year, from the Boys and Girls Club of America. Councilman Gibson stated that he will be asking members of the Action Committee to provide telephone numbers or email addresses that the public can use when they need a concern addressed. He commented that the Traffic Safety Committee met and it was decided that Route 19 at Broad and Livingston Streets needs a Do Not Enter sign. He stated that double parking at School 14 and speeding in the area of School 1 are problems which police will be sure to enforce. He asked that an article be published in the local paper asking parents not to double park when dropping children off at school. Councilman Gibson announced that the City

has switched their 911 system to a Swift Reach Network. He explained to residents how to register for the system. Councilman Gibson discussed adding additional Police Officers and police starting salaries. In closing, Councilman Gibson asked that the line painting on Parker Avenue gets done before the weather gets too cold. City Manager, Dominick Villano, responded that the line painting work has already been ordered.

Councilman Grabowski

Councilman Grabowski congratulated the girls' softball team on their recent State Championship. He addressed the residents of Prospect Street, and suggested they talk to the neighbors who are feeding the cats. Councilman Gibson thanked Kim Castellano and ImageFirst for sending volunteers to spruce up Van Houten Avenue. He asked City Manager, Dominick Villano, if the flashing speed limit signs have been ordered for Dwasline Road. Mr. Villano responded that the money has to be put into the proper account, then the signs can be ordered. He stated that temporary signs will be used until the new ones are installed. Councilman Grabowski suggested that during a State of Emergency, due to snow, the City's Noise Ordinance should be relaxed to allow for earlier snow removal. City Attorney, Matthew Priore, stated that the Ordinance does not apply to snow plows but he will review the Ordinance to see if it includes snow blowers.

Councilman Hatala

Councilman Hatala congratulated the girls' softball team on their State Championship. He stated that the additional street lights requested by the residents of Prospect Street should be done as soon as possible for safety reasons. Councilman Hatala asked if Prospect Street could be put on the list for a crackdown on speeding. Councilman Hatala commented that the Economic Development Committee will meet shortly and will discuss the status of the Hoffman LaRoche site development. He asked City Manager, Dominick Villano, the status of current road projects. Mr. Villano stated that he would have a report by the next Council Meeting. Councilman Hatala stated that the anticipated bond rates will be favorable to the City. He also said the Fire Committee is working on long range plans for the Fire Department. Councilman Hatala commented on a traffic light on Lake Avenue needs adjustment because the way it is situated it is confusing drivers. He asked City Manager, Dominick Villano, when the fountain will be replaced in Botany Village. Mr. Villano said the plans are done and the work will be started shortly. He requested that speed tables be utilized on certain streets in the City. Councilman Hatala stated that enforcement by the Police Department has been stepped up in regard to speeding, double parking at schools and cell phone usage while driving. In closing Councilman Hatala expressed his sympathy to the victims and families of the tragic mass shooting in Las Vegas.

Councilman Kolodziej

Councilman Kolodziej thanked the residents of Prospect Street for letting the Council know about the issues of animals, lighting and speeding in their neighborhood. He thanked Mr. Robertello for showing his appreciation for the road and drainage work recently completed on Woodlawn Avenue. Councilman Kolodziej stated that the bond interest rate is good and urges his colleagues to vote to put more money towards existing notes so they do not have to be converted to bonds in the future. He commented that it was nice to hear that Councilman Gibson had a change of heart regarding the budgeting for more police officers. Councilman Kolodziej discussed utilizing a Pittman Schedule for the Police Department. In closing, he announced the Clifton Arts Center will be hosting a Tea and Conversation at the Valley Regency on October 15th.

Councilwoman Murphy

Councilwoman Murphy was absent.

Mayor Anzaldi

Mayor Anzaldi expressed his condolences to the victims and families of the recent shooting in Las Vegas. He announced that the NJ Symphony Orchestra will be playing at School #3 and that the Centennial Gala will be on November 30th. He congratulated Carlos Polanco on winning National Youth of the Year from the Boys and Girls Club. Mayor Anzaldi also congratulated the girls' softball team on their State Championship. He announced that Clifton was named a Tree City from the NJ Forest Service.

WHEREAS, a Budgetary Emergency has arisen with respect to the Buildings Department’s (DPW) Operating Expense Budget has been fully expended and not enough of an adequate provision was made in the 2017 Budget for the aforesaid purpose; and,

WHEREAS, in the 2017 Municipal Budget, the City Council approved an operating expense budget for the Buildings Department (DPW) of \$312,000; and,

WHEREAS, this operating budget included a budget funding of \$50,000 for unforeseen emergency repair expenses, as properly declared, in the 2017 Municipal Budget; and,

WHEREAS, this budgetary expense is now needed to maintain the Buildings Department’s (DPW) spending and projects through the end of this budgetary year;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, by the Mayor and City Council of the City of Clifton, County of Passaic, State of New Jersey, that the \$50,000 in Emergency Repair Budget Funding be released to be used by the Buildings Department (DPW) through the end of the year.

WHEREAS, the City Engineer has requested that a Change Order be made to the contract awarded to MONTANA CONSTRUCTION CORP., INC., in the amount of \$99,209.93 a 10.29% Increase as authorized by Resolution said being necessary as the project was unable to be completed as designed and had to be extended beyond the original scope; and

WHEREAS, the City of Clifton desires to comply with said regulations, and to the end herewith files with the Governing Body a report of the Engineering Department stating the facts involved and indicating that the proposed contract Change Order is necessary and should be approved and allowed; and

WHEREAS, the Chief Financial Officer has certified the availability of sufficient funds for the amendatory change for which authorization is requested in the amount of \$99,209.93 a 10.29% INCREASE;

WHEREAS, the total contract amount is now \$1,063,691.87:
