CITY MANAGER PRIVILEGE

City Manager, Dominick Villano, had nothing to report.

FLOOR TO MEMBERS OF THE PUBLIC

Ellen DeLosh, 547 Clifton Ave., read a letter she received from the Tea Party Campaign.

Ray Robertello, 66 Woodlawn Ave., announced the Gay Pride flag raising will be held on June 23, 2018 at 11am. He spoke about a positive experience he had with the mother of a transgender child he met at a Pride picnic in Bloomfield, NJ.

Caitlin White, Vincent Drive, spoke about side conversations taking place at council meetings, permit parking, contract negotiations and the paving work recently done on Vincent Drive.

Joe Sidor, 181 Highview Drive, spoke about recently published planned pay raises for Passaic Valley Water Commission employees and the effect on the institute's budget. He announced the 68th anniversary of the Korean War. He thanked President Trump for negotiating the return of fallen American soldiers from the Korean War. He spoke about police brutality in the media. Mr. Sidor asked all residents to support their local police, the City of Clifton and the Clifton Council. He mentioned the Meet Clifton show on the Clifton Cable Channel is a wonderful show and he gave special mention to an episode which demonstrated how to fold the American Flag.

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Kristin Cardell, 50 Luisser St., spoke about an incident she experienced when an ambulance was called to assist her and a meeting she was supposed to attend regarding the incident but was cancelled at the last minute. Ms. Cardell also mentioned that individuals keep parking in her husband's assigned handicapped parking space.

Steven Goldberg, 124 Charles Street, spoke about Relay for Life, an episode on the Meet Clifton show which showed cigar rolling, high sewer bills, outdated zoning laws, firemen living in temporary small trailers and police salaries.

A Motion was made by Councilman Eagler, seconded by Councilman Grabowski and passed on roll call vote to close the public session.

(7-0-0-0) Councilman Eagler, Councilman Gibson, Councilman Grabowski, Councilman Hatala, Councilman Kolodziej, Councilwoman Murphy and Mayor Anzaldi voted aye.

Mayor Anzaldi asked City Attorney, Matthew Priore, when a complaint of someone parked illegally in a handicapped spot cannot be handled in a timely manner by the police, if the public can take a picture of the illegally parked vehicle and sign a complaint. Mr. Priore stated that they can.

Mayor Anzaldi asked about the meeting that Ms. Cardell wanted to attend. City Manager, Dominick Villano, apologized for the late notice to Ms. Cardell and stated that he cannot comment on disciplinary matters.

COUNCIL PRIVILEGE

Councilman Eagler

Councilman Eagler asked City Manager, Dominick Villano, to have potholes on Urma and Van Houten Avenues repaired. He announced the State will be introducing a new budget which could add additional funding for schools. Councilman Eagler stated that the application to the Board of Adjustment to build townhouses on the Richfield Farms property has been withdrawn. He stated the Passaic County is in negotiations to purchase local farm land. He thanked all the Avenue of Flag volunteers who helped with the memorial for Mr. John Biegel, Jr. Councilman Eagler announced St. Peter's Haven is hosting a Tricky Tray on June 23, 2018.

Mayor Anzaldi asked City Attorney, Matthew Priore, to explain the time line from the beginning of negotiations, to the final signing of the contract in reference to employee contracts.

Mr. Priore stated that a memorandum of agreement is put into place for general items. He stated that the memorandum of agreement allows for certain items to go forward even though the agreement has not yet been executed.

Councilman Eagler said he printed a copy of the draft bill concerning the legalization of marijuana for review by the Law Department.

Councilman Gibson

Councilman Gibson commented on the flag folding procedure he witnessed at a recent event. He felt it is a good idea to teach this exercise to school children. Councilman Gibson wished Anthony Marrone good luck on his retirement. He thanked City Manager, Dominick Villano, for overseeing a wonderful job on the maintenance of City Hall grounds. Councilman Gibson congratulated all the 2018 graduates. He asked for volunteers for Project Graduation and that all residents support city farms. Councilman Gibson spoke about summer safety concerns. In closing, he asked City Manager, Dominick Villano, to have the County clean up highway ramps.

Councilwoman Murphy

Councilwoman Murphy announced the following events: Family fitness classes, free concerts, Saint Peter's food drive and the Gay Pride flag raising. She announced that Relay for Life raised over 50K.

Councilwoman Murphy left the meeting at 9:15pm.

Councilman Grabowski

Councilman Grabowski expressed his condolences to the Barilari Family on the passing of Aulo Barilari. He thanked public speaker, Joseph Sidor, for his kind words regarding the flag raising episode on the Meet Clifton television show. Councilman Grabowski stated he received many calls regarding parking in the area of Mount Prospect Park when little league is using the park. He asked that the County or State be contacted to clean up the ramp from Route 46 to Broad Street.

Councilman Hatala

Councilman Hatala mentioned the Economic Development Committee is currently discussing an appropriate use for the property that Richfield Farms is seeking to sell. He stated the Bond Advisory Committee is working on obtaining funds for capital projects. Councilman Hatala spoke about changing outdated zoning and variance laws. He talked about sewer fees, handicapped parking and diversity. Councilman Hatala stated the City's bond rating is strong. He asked residents to please appreciate the hard work of the police department. In closing, Councilman Hatala congratulated the School Board on another successful school year and wished all 2018 graduates continued success.

Councilman Kolodziej

Councilman Kolodziej spoke about sewer fees. He explained that a tax is subject to a 2% cap but a fee is not. That is why the sewer fee is not capped at 2%. He stated that since the sewer fee is based on water consumption that conserving water would, in turn, reduce sewer fees. He explained that the DPW, Fire Department and Police Department are growing while keeping the tax rate under the 2% gap. He stated it is not easy to keep a balance between services and taxes. Councilman Kolodziej said that the current Council focuses on solutions. He stated that despite what some people have been saying, every business and homeowner in the City pays a sewer fee. Councilman Kolodziej suggested anyone who is going to obtain information through the Open Public Records Act should fully understand the information prior to giving misleading information to the public. Councilman Kolodziej urged all residents to attend the Pride flag raising on June 23rd. He thanked everyone who volunteered for the recent Amazing Foods event. Councilman Kolodziej expressed his condolences to the Tripodi and Hiel families on the passing of Lorraine Tripodi.

Mayor Anzaldi

Mayor Anzaldi announced the City Picnic and Fireworks show to take place on July 4th. He spoke about sewer fees and the importance of good quality of life for all residents. Mayor Anzaldi spoke about a recent incident where an erroneous survey was sent out to the public. He asked everyone to support our police because they are our first line of defense.
