November 2, 2020

(7-0-0-0) Councilman Eagler, Councilman Gibson, Councilman Grabowski, Councilwoman Murphy, Councilwoman Pino, Councilwoman Sadrakula and Mayor Anzaldi voted aye.

CITY MANAGER PRIVILEGE

City Manager, Dominick Villano, announced that installation of a new sound system will begin shortly and that the Council Meeting of November 16, 2020 will be held in the auditorium of Clifton High School. He spoke about following protocols during the Coronavirus pandemic. Mr. Villano discussed recent recurrent flooding on Clifton Avenue and asked that it be added to the Executive Session Agenda. Councilwoman Sadrakula objected to discussing the item in Executive Session. Mr. Villano stated it involves acquiring land, which requires it to be discussed in Executive Session.

FLOOR TO MEMBERS OF THE PUBLIC

Steve Goldberg, 124 Charles St., remarked that the public should be able to join public Zoom meetings. He spoke about the need to update the City's Zoning ordinances and the installation of sidewalks on Dwasline Road. Mr. Goldberg stated that the current City Council has had two years to try to get along and that the arguing is embarrassing.

Peggy Salierno, 15 Woodward Ave., asked why the sidewalk ends on Dwasline Road and why there are no sidewalks on Pine Brae Lane and Allwood Place. Ms. Salierno asked why a sewer truck is always at the intersection of Virginia and Woodward Avenues.

Henry Cholewczynski, 37 Phyllis Place, discussed installing sidewalks on Dwasline Ave. and in all sections of the City where needed for safety. He also stated that Latteri Park needs renovations and suggested that the City start a savings fund dedicated to park renovations.

Ann Schnackenberg, 268 Washington Ave., discussed access to public meetings, sidewalks, traffic lights, crosswalks and handicapped access. She suggested using Google Earth to determine which streets in the City do not have sidewalks.

Judith Bassford, 92 Mountainview Dr., discussed Governor Murphy's Executive Order #173 which deals with room capacities during the pandemic. She also discussed residences that do not have sidewalks in front of the home.

Michelle Gaudet, 28 Bergen Ave., discussed the installation of sidewalks and safety. She thanked the DPW for the garden which was planted at Nash Park. Ms. Gaudet asked when the bathrooms at Nash Park would be reopened. She remarked that she agrees with employee evaluations.

Paula Fields, calling for Linda Roller, 157 Rock Hill Rd., asked for help regarding the condition of a home on 173 Rock Hill Road. She described the conditions as standing water, containers containing an unknown liquid and rodents.

Mary Flynn, 14 Breen Court, suggested that someone from the City reach out to the residents at 173 Rock Hill Road who may possibly need some assistance with their situation.

Tony Wizner, Manager of Milano's Restaurant, 561 Van Houten Ave., discussed the City's decision to cancel Entertainment Licenses during the pandemic.

Faith Webb, 23 Strangeway Terrace, expressed concern for the safety of children walking on Clifton Boulevard in areas where there are no sidewalks.

City Manager, Dominick Villano, stated that he responded to the speaker that was concerned with the condition of a property on Rock Hill Road earlier in the day and that the matter is currently in the court system and cannot be discussed.

Councilwoman Pino asked why the decision to cancel Entertainment Licenses was not brought to Council. City Manager, Dominick Villano, explained that it was a decision of the Health Officer

due to the pandemic spiking. Councilwoman Sadrakula discussed the need to be equitable when voting on events amid the pandemic. City Attorney, Matthew Priore, announced that a new ruling will be coming forth from Governor Murphy later in the week. A discussion took place regarding Café Licenses, the safety of erecting tents for outdoor dining in winter weather and heaters for outdoor dining. Mayor Anzaldi suggested writing to the Attorney General for guidance with this issue. Direction was given to the City Manager to contact the Governor's Office regarding Entertainment Licenses during the pandemic. Councilwoman Pino suggested that establishments should submit a plan which would include the type of entertainment they wish for review on a case by case basis rather than prohibit entertainment all together.

Direction was given to City Manager, Dominick Villano, to research what sewer work is being done on the corner of Virginia and Woodward Avenues and inform Ms. Salierno of the results.

Direction was given to the City Clerk to compile a list of roads mentioned in the public session that do not have sidewalks.

City Manager, Dominick Villano, remarked that Google Earth cannot be used to determine which roads do not have sidewalks due to the fact that Google Earth images. could be two to three years behind.

COUNCIL PRIVILEGE

Councilman Eagler

Councilman Eagler announced that all PTR forms that were due on November 1, 2020 have been extended to December 31, 2020. He suggested to anyone that needs help completing the forms contact the Senior Center. Councilman Eagler discussed St. Peter's Thanksgiving food drive. He announced that there will be 6 polling places open for the upcoming election and that the mail-in ballot box will close at 8p.m. on Election Day.

Councilman Gibson

Councilman Gibson discussed flooding on certain areas of Clifton Avenue. He remarked on the condition and lack of sidewalks on Allwood Place, near Latteri Park and on Colfax Avenue. Councilman Gibson discussed the need to reopen the bathrooms at Nash Park. He thanked all Veteran's for their service.

Councilman Grabowski

Councilman Grabowski announced an upcoming Veteran's Day celebration. He thanked DPW employee, Janet Lapinski for her work in securing a grant which provided for planting of 50 trees in Nash Park. He also thanked all the DPW employees for their hard work. Councilman Grabowski expressed concern regarding extending sidewalks on Dwasline Road to Allwood Road. He remarked that the area is a very dangerous spot for pedestrians to be crossing Allwood Road. Councilman Grabowski urged all residents to vote in the upcoming election.

Councilwoman Murphy

Councilwoman Murphy read Recreation Department news. She announced that the Halloween Contest deadline was extended to November 3, 2020. Councilwoman Murphy said the Salute to Veterans event will take place on November 20, 2020 and meals will be delivered to the Veterans' homes. She urged all residents to vote in the election and stated that the mail-in ballot boxes will be locked at 8:00p.m. on Election Day.

Councilwoman Pino

Councilwoman Pino asked that a thank you note be sent to the Board of Education to thank them for their help with the Census. She asked if a meeting of the Recycling Committee has been scheduled. City Manager, Dominick Villano, stated that a meeting has not been scheduled yet because the Auditors need to provide information to discuss at the meeting. She asked for the

minutes/notes of the last Recycling Meeting. Councilwoman Pino discussed the possibility of turmoil around the nation surrounding Election Day and asked that City residents remain peaceful. She thanked the Council Members for supporting the anti-discrimination Resolution. Councilwoman Pino read the Resolution.

Councilwoman Sadrakula

Councilwoman Sadrakula discussed potholes, traffic issues and newly erected telephone poles that are taller than normal. Mr. Villano said the BPU approves these poles and they are higher due to the fact that they carry more voltage than the shorter poles. Councilwoman Sadrakula remarked on not receiving information she asks for, receiving copies of bills that are redacted, eye rolling at the Council meetings and the use of cell phones at the dais. She spoke about the public having access to join Council meetings and the withdrawal of Entertainment Licenses during the pandemic. Councilwoman Sadrakula urged all residents to vote in the upcoming election.

Mayor Anzaldi

Mayor Anzaldi announced two Veterans Day celebrations. November 8, 2020 on City Hall grounds and November 11, 2020, food will be delivered to the homes of Veterans. He urged all residents to vote in the upcoming election. Mayor Anzaldi announced that, due to the pandemic, voting locations have changed and residents should check with the City Clerk if they are not sure of their polling location. He asked residents to remain calm at the polls.
