Councilman Kolodziej stated that the Bond Advisory/Finance Committee met recently. Subjects discussed were the City's debt structure, interest rates and ways to accelerate debt payoff. Councilman Kolodziej announced that a joint meeting with the Board of Education is scheduled for October 10, 2016.

She stated that the Recreation Committee met and discussed the Halloween Parade and the holiday Candyland event. Councilwoman Murphy asked if there has been any movement regarding the paving of Dwasline Road. City Manager, Dominick Villano, stated that bids will be received this upcoming week. Councilwoman Murphy reminded all residents that the deadline for mail in voting is up to seven days prior to the election.

Mayor Anzaldi

Mayor Anzaldi announced that Anthony's Coal Fired Pizza will be holding a fundraiser for the Clifton Veterans Committee. He thanked everyone who donated to the Veterans Day Parade. Mayor Anzaldi announced ad journals, boosters and t-shirts are available for purchase to support the City's 100th Anniversary celebration. He mentioned that Clifton High School will be sponsoring and International Food Festival on October 15, 2016. Mayor Anzaldi urged anyone interested in participating in the parade to let him know. He also announced that the annual John Samra run is taking place this weekend and urged residents to join the run or make a donation.

Matthew Priore, City Attorney, stated that the request from Bliss Lounge to have entertainment on October 9, 2016 was rescinded by Bliss Lounge. The representative of Bliss Lounge, Glen Franco, was advised that any requests for entertainment, outside of the regular times of Thursday, Friday and Saturday, will require a written notification of the event to neighbors within 200' of the establishment.

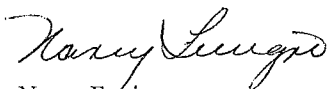

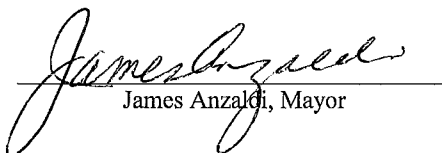
ADJOURNMENT
